Meijo University Exchange Program (MEP-J and MEP-E combined)

Application Guideline

Spring Semester, 2024

We would like to introduce you all with 2 exchange programs in this guideline. One is called Meijo Exchange Program in Japanese (MEP-J) and the other one is called Meijo Exchange Program in English (MEP-E). Participants who join in MEP-J will belong to a Faculty and select specialized subjects and study Intermediate to Advanced levels of Japanese Language classes. Whereas MEP-E's students will be with the Faculty of Foreign Studies, and study International Japanese Studies and basic levels of Japanese Language classes. These courses for MEP-E students are specially designed only for exchange students.

First, here is a chart describing the differences between the programs.

MEP-J (Japanese based)

The following is a guideline of <u>Meijo University</u>'s student exchange program in <u>Japanese</u> (MEP-J) to accept students from the universities which Meijo University (MU) already has MOU on student exchange.

Requirements to apply

Each applicant must satisfy all of the following points.

- (1) At the time of application, an applicant must have passed JLPT N2 or higher.
 - **A student who is expected to surely pass JLPT N2 is also eligible to apply.
- (2) A recommendation letter must be issued from the university to which the applicant belongs stating the applicant's satisfactory academic record.
- (3) An applicant must be enthusiastic to take part in international exchange activities at MU.

Details of program

Program policy

The program provides opportunities to improve Japanese language and to study specialized subjects taught <u>in</u> <u>Japanese</u>. The students must have intermediate level of Japanese language skills.

(1) Faculties

Exchange student (ES) will belong to one of the following faculties.

- Faculty of Law

**Please note that the final decision of acceptance of an applicant and allocation to faculty will be done by MU.

(2) Program commence

This exchange program is to commence from March and September every year and ES can study at MU for one semester or one academic year. Currently MU is accepting applicants for March 2024 enrollment.

Curriculum

(1) Japanese language subjects

MU provides Japanese language courses for ES. After arriving in Japan, <u>ES will be informed of the courses to take based on the result of the placement test by MU.</u>

**Please note that ES cannot decide the courses by him/herself and that ES may not take part in all Japanese courses available.

(2) Specialized Subjects

ES can take courses (except some) taught in their faculties and also some courses taught in other faculties which accept ES. When registering courses, ES should take time for moving between campuses into consideration.

MEP-E (English based)

The following is the guideline of <u>Meijo University's student exchange program in English</u> (**MEP-E**) to accept students from the universities which MU already has MOU on student exchange program.

Requirements to apply

Each applicant must satisfy all of the following points.

- (1) A recommendation letter must be issued from the university to which the applicant belongs stating the applicant's satisfactory academic record and ability to take lessons in English.
- (2) An applicant must be enthusiastic to take part in international exchange activities organized by MU.

Details of program

(1) Program policy

The program provides opportunities to understand more about Japan in English while participants are learning basic Japanese.

(2) Program commence

This is to commence from March and September every year and Exchange student (**ES**) can study at MU for one semester or one year. Currently MU is accepting applicants for March 2024 enrollment.

(3) Curriculum

We provide the following subjects specially designed for this exchange program.

Japanese language subjects

MU provides multiple level courses currently in 2 levels. Each semester for our ES and these courses will be held on Tempaku and Dome-mae Campus. One course includes two 90-minute lectures/lessons in a week. According to our academic calendar, a semester consists of 15 weeks. That means if you choose 2 subjects to study, you are studying 90 hours of Japanese language subjects in a semester. Meijo University will be awarding 4 credit points for the 2 subjects.

Please note that ES cannot decide the courses by him/herself and the decision will be made by Meijo University.

● International Japanese Studies subjects (available only for MEP-E students)

Japanese Studies will be taught in English to learn more about its culture, history and Chubu area around us. From history of Japan to a part of Japanese Literature, you can explore wide variety of fields about Japan. Depending on which term you are participating, subjects that you can study varies. One course includes one 90-

minute lectures/lessons in a week. With 15 weeks of your study, you are studying 22.5 hours and 2 credits will be awarded for each subject.

Please note that some of the Japanese Studies subjects are compulsory but the others are selective.

Rule for receiving Scholarship

All international students, including ESs must come to Office of International Affairs to sign our form at the beginning of every month, in order to prove that these students are studying at our university (When Meijo University is on holidays and students decide to go back to their country/s and are not available to sign, they cannot receive our Scholarship for that particular month).

● The number of ES and scholarship

MU will honor scholarship to ES. The maximum number of ES entitled to receive scholarship will be notified by MU accordingly.

Calculation of the number of ES:

"1" : full-year (2semesters) student

"0.5" : 1-semester student

MU offers scholarship of 25,000 yen per month to each ES.

Dormitory Rent and support by MU

ES can stay at the dormitory arranged by MU. While the rent is 47,500 yen per month, actual amount each ES has to pay is 25,000 yen per month since MU pays 22,500 yen monthly to reduce the financial burden of ES. Utilities are to be paid by ES.

Date of Arrival

The actual date will be informed after the application is accepted. Please note that ES should arrive on the designated date since necessary procedures are scheduled before the program begins.MU staff will be at Chubu International Airport on the arrival date to pick up ES. Please do not plan any trips out of town for around 2 weeks after the arrival as important events and orientations are scheduled.

Fees and costs

As stipulated in the agreement of student exchange program, the tuition at MU is waived. Other expenses are

to be paid by ES including the monthly fee for the dormitory and utility fees. ES also need to buy own textbooks for lessons.

Events

The Office of International Affairs of MU plans various events and programs for ES to learn and experience Japanese culture and its people.

Student Assistant (SA)

"Student Assistant (SA)" is a name of registered volunteers among MU students to support ES. SA plans studentoriented events and supports ES to learn Japanese as a "Speaking Partner".

Facilities and Equipment

Student ID cards will be issued to ES. ES can use most of MU facilities such as libraries.

Club Activities

MU has more than 130 clubs for students' sports activities and cultural activities. Please let us know if you are interested in to take part in these club activities shown in the following site.

Insurance

ES needs to join to National Health Insurance which is a public medical insurance of Japan. Insurance premium is about 1,200~1,400yen per month. National Health Insurance covers 70% of total medical expense and ES pays only 30%. MU staff will take ES to the ward office for the necessary procedure to join the insurance and ES will make monthly payment hereafter. Although National Health Insurance covers 70% of medical expense, it does not cover other liabilities or extraordinary expense such as transportation cost to go back to own country in case of emergency. Therefore every ES is strongly requested to personally join overseas travel insurance.

Part time job

All ES need to report to MU in advance and get approval in order to avoid troubles with employers. If ES needs to work part time by financial reasons, MU may admit considering the situation and proficiency of Japanese.

Please note that ES with student status has to get permission to engage in activity other than the permitted from Immigration Bureau in order to work part time.

Other matters to pay attention

While staying in Japan ES is not allowed to drive a car or to operate anything which requires a license.

In addition to the above mentioned, MU may stop the program and advice to leave Japan in case of unreported absence, unfavorable academic performance or negligence of guidance by MU.


